Dear Friends of OBI,

Christ-centered Humanitarian Assistance Continues in Sri Lanka

Following the tsunami disaster in December 2004, OBI mobilized resources to support the work of the military involved in recovery efforts. That was only the beginning. The work in Sri Lanka has developed into one of most comprehensive programs in OBI history related to support of the active military. Early on, OBI shipped a forty-foot container of medical equipment and supplies to help upgrade the capabilities of the rehabilitation hospital to treat disabled soldiers. The support continues. Sri Lankan program manager Bill Barko and Richard Stiliha are currently working with the commanders of both the Sri Lankan Army and Air Force in the following areas:

- Training and leadership development program for pre-command and staff college courses and senior operational and medical leadership.
- Support to military members who have lost limbs or have been paralyzed due to the conflict with the Tamil Tigers
- At the request of the Ministry of Defense, a Home-Building project for soldiers who lost their dwellings due to the tsunami is to be completed in late April, and the Secretary of Defense, brother of the President, has requested support for several other programs

Medical and Family Support Training Programs Support the Sri Lankan Military

The Sri Lankan Army suffers casualties daily. The war with the Tamil Tigers demands a high level of readiness. Casualties are frequent.

- In April 2006, the Commander of the Army escaped an assassination attempt.
- In June, the Deputy Chief of Staff (a War College grad) was assassinated.
- OBI volunteers including Bill, Richard, and Vic Salazar risked their lives to work with the military in February. They brought support in the areas of counseling, suicide prevention and management of depression, pain management, alcohol and drug abuse prevention, combat stress, building and maintaining strong families, and community support programs.



While in Sri Lanka OBI works to under-gird the Military Christian Fellowship in their initiatives as well. Here you can see Dick and Bill giving bibles to an Air Force Officer for use with Air Force Military Christian Fellowship. In the last several years the MCF has grown significantly. As a result of OBI's efforts in Sri Lanka, the Maldives have asked to receive similar training and are willing to pay to receive this training.
